

Jane Gwyn Robertson Zimmerman Scholarship

The Jane Gwyn Robertson Zimmerman Scholarship provides a \$3,000 two-year award (\$1,500 per year) to an Orange County High School graduate who intends to pursue a teaching career, with preference given to those interested in English or journalism. Applicants must demonstrate financial need and they must maintain a GPA of 3.0 or higher..

The fund was established in 1999 through a request from the estate of Marie Ellis Robertson, to honor the memory of her sister, Jane Gwyn Robertson Zimmerman, who passed away on January 17, 1977. Jane Gwyn Robertson Zimmerman, known to her family and friends as "Gwyn," was a member of the Orange County High School Class of 1964. During her time at OCHS, Gwyn was involved in numerous activities, including the Debate Club, Future Teachers of America, Latin Club, Spotswood Players, and Girls' State. She also served as the reporter and historian of the Honor Society, assistant editor of the school newspaper, and manager of the girls' basketball team. In addition to these activities, Gwyn was an honor student, a National Merit Scholarship semi-finalist, Homecoming Princess, and wrote a weekly column for the Orange County Review.

After graduation, Gwyn went on to receive an BA degree from Duke University, where she served as class secretary of the junior class, and an MAT degree from Simmons College. She went on to teach English and speed reading. She also served as the associate editor of Textile Industries, a trade magazine, in addition to reporting and writing feature articles for various newspapers. The scholarship organization and the Orange County Education Foundation would like to present 1 scholarship to a graduating senior in the class of 2021. The completed application and essay is due to the counseling center by **April 15, 2021.**
